1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Khoirabari College is situated in Barbalisitha village which is in the 6th schedule Area (Bodoland) under the Tribal Belt & Block, P.O.+ P.S.- Khoirabari, District Udalguri B.T.R, Assam-784522. It is a rural area and located in the western part of Udalguri district. It is a Border district with Bhutan.

The College was established on 16th August 1993 with the objective of providing quality higher education at an affordable cost to the marginalized section of the locality. Since its beginning with two rooms, the college has grown into a leading higher educational institution with its own campus and infrastructure to accommodate around 1400 students in undergraduate level in Arts Stream and 60 students in PGDCA course. We also offer UG and PG courses in ODL mode under KKHSOU, Guwahati.

The College is permanently affiliated to Bodoland University from 2020-21, earlier it was under Gauhati University and is a Co-educational institution. The core subjects offered by the college are Assamese, Bodo, Economics, Education, English, Geography, History, Political Science and PGDCA and Certificate Courses are offered. The College has been included under sections 2(f) on 14/07/2008 and 12(b) on 04/02/2010 as per the UGC Act, 1956. The Library has a holding of around 14200 books, 6 print journals and large number of online Journal through N-List.

The College is going to get accredited by NAAC for the first time and preparations are going on.

The institution is following Three Year Degree Course since 1993 and from 2019-20 sessions, CBCS system introduced as per the directions of Gauhati University. In 2020 the College was transferred to Bodoland University and following the CBCS Pattern of the University.

Girls Hostel having a Capacity for 40 boarders but due to local problems there is no boarders in the hostel. There is an Indoor Stadium, Multi-Purpose Gymnasium, Auditorium and three Smart Classroom in the College. There is playground for outdoor games.

The College is a Tobacco Free Zone and Green Campus. The social environment of the college is a very harmonious one with students from various communities and religious background study here without any kind of discrimination.

They rush here to attain academic excellence, professional competence and to develop skills necessary for pursuing personal and social dreams. It has been its relentless effort to inspire the students for

their all-round development. so that they can understand the values of National Integration, Social Harmony and Secularism.

1.2 Strength, Weakness, Opportunity and Challenges(SWOC)

Institutional Strength

Khoirabari College is located in an ecologically rich region in the district of Udalguri of Assam where the renowned Eco-tourism of the Assam and North-East India Bogamati and renowned of Pygmy hog (Nol Gahori) Bornadi Wildlife Sanctuary is also located just a few Kilometers away to the North of college.

The college has a visionary management team to lead the institution towards achieving higher academic excellence.

College is located in a comparatively pollution free, disease free and crime free region.

The college has sufficient amount of land (9.179 Acre) for its future development and to lead the Institution up to university level.

The local community along with different local institutions and agencies has an well-established link and coordination with the college and they have well wishes and good faith on the institution.

The college has started to take bold initiative to digitalized the whole functionary of the college to build the academic environment to feet with the modern age of science and technology.

Institutional Weakness

The college is located in a rural and economically backward area of Assam.

The college has very limited sources of income generation.

The college has only arts stream and the students aspiring for higher studies in science and commerce have no option other than going to other institutions. Although Assam Government declared to open Science Stream yet the stream has not been started till now by the government of Assam.

Limited Staff in sanctioned post is another weakness of the College.

Lack of sufficient infrastructural facilities.

Most of the students are from poor financial background and this affects their learning environment.

The road communication of the feeding area is very deplorable.

Institutional Opportunity

There is the opportunity to upgrade the certificate courses of the college into skill oriented diploma courses for better future of the students.

College has some special advantages of getting autonomous status in the upcoming days.

College has the opportunity to work more for expanding e-learning.

College has the opportunity to introduce different skill development courses along with some science and commerce programs.

The college has the opportunity to work in the field of developing small scale and cottage industries on the basis of local resources in an innovative way.

The college has the opportunity to develop the potentiality of students sports and co-curricular activities.

Institutional Challenge

The surrounding area of the college is affected by heavy flood every year due to which the development of academic environment is hampered.

Shortage of sufficient fund is another challenge of the college because of which all round development of the college could not be achieved as desired.

Limited teaching staff in sanctioned post is another challenge of the college due to which the college couldn't keep pace with the development of global educational atmosphere.

Lake of sufficient research infrastructure is also a challenge of the college due to which the college could not move forward properly in the sphere of research and development.

The problem of student's dropout is another major challenge of the college. This Problem occurs every year because most of the students of the college are from poor economic background.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

Khoirabari College follows the Under Graduate Level Curriculum of Arts Streams prepared by its parent University. The Academic Committee of the College prepares an Annual Academic Calendar based on the Calendar of the University. The Calendar so prepared is publicized in the College Prospectus and also published through the College website and Notice Board of the College.

A Master Routine is also prepared by the Class Routine Committee and the Academic Committee. All Heads of the Departments distribute the courses amongst the faculty members and prepare the departmental class routines accordingly.

Class attendance of the students is recorded in the Class Register Books.

One Sessional Examination is conducted as per Academic Calendar for each semester. The Sessional and the University Final Examinations held in the college are conducted by the Examination Committee of the College. The marks of the Sessional Examinations are maintained in the departmental progressive record book and the results of the Final Examinations are recorded centrally in the office of the college.

For participatory learning, departmental Wall Magazines, College Magazine are prepared and field visit, survey works are organized. The Project works and Field works provide the students the opportunities of experiential learning.

Faculty members of the College participate in assessment and evaluation process for UG programmes of Arts Stream of the university.

The Three Year Degree Course had been started since the beginning of the College, Semester System had been introduced by the College since 2011-12 and CBCS System has been implemented from the academic session 2019-20 as per guidelines of University.

A total of 02 Certificate Courses have been offered by the institution since 2016-17 academic session.

The college collects Feedbacks from students, teachers and alumni along with from employers of outgoing students on various aspects of the institution. Feedback reports and analysis are submitted to the authority of the College for necessary action

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

Khoirabari College obeys the guidelines of the Government of India against reserved categories during college admission every year. Of course, the college cannot follow the Govt. criteria in case of S.T. reservation as the area falls under the Tribal Belt and Block.

The college follows a student centric evaluation process throughout the academic year/semester wise like sessional examinations, Home Assignment, Project preparation, Field study and survey, excursion etc. Apart from these, class test, group discussion, quiz, debate, extempore speech etc. are organized as an extension activities for the welfare of the students.

The college has an experienced 21 nos. of full time qualified teachers and a good number of part-time teachers. They are capable of motivating the students and delivering messages to the society. Khoirabari College being a higher educational institution along with B.A. course offers PGDCA diploma course for ICT learning for the student of the college.

The college has been able to maintain the average pass percentage above 69.47. It is mentioned worthy to note that though the college runs only single stream, it enrolls good numbers of students from different groups of the society.

Research, Innovations and Extension

The Faculties of the Khoirabari College are involved in Research, Innovation and Extension activities. Dr. Nripesh Kailta has completed one MRP during 2017-18 funded by UGC. The institution has created on Innovation system in the college which includes areas like publications of Books with ISBN, articles in Research Journal with ISSN, Awareness programmes on AIDS, Road & safety measures, Disaster and Fire, Health and Education etc. In addition to these, the research project is being done through field investigation, field trips and excursion. Remedial classes are provided for the slow learners, to cope up with other students. Online mode of class is another innovative endeavor during the time of Covid-19 pandemic. The faculties of the college as well as IQAC have taken different community development services namely, awareness, plantation, cleanliness drive in the nearby areas, Volunteer services through NSS in different festivals and conferences.

The Khoirabari College Students Union has been actively involved in the observation of different festivals namely, Saraswati Puja, Bathou Puja, and Freshmen Social ceremony in every year. Every year Khoirabari College Students Union election is being held for smooth functioning of the Student community. The IQAC has observed the foundation day of Bodo Sahitya Sabha etc. The Governing Body of the College has arranged the Farewell ceremony to Dr. Hiran Deka Narzi, founder principal of the college. International Women's Day, Human rights Day, Teachers Day is also celebrated in the college. Plantation in World Environment Day is another aspect done by IQAC of the College.

Faculties of the college have presented Research paper and participated in the National and International seminars. During Covid-19 crisis the teachers extended hands to the poor people with cash and kind as well as especially able person. Poor students in the adopted village are being felicitated to encourage for higher studies. Students and Teachers exchange programmes with different institutions and organizations are done through singing MOU.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

Khoirabari College, established in 1993, is located in Bhergaon sub-division of Udalguri district in Assam, 45 km away from district head quarter. It is located on a peaceful rural area comprised of 30 Bighas of land to provide an equipped academic ambience. There are 12 nos. of Class rooms out of which 3 nos. is ICT enabled class rooms with projectors. All the class rooms are sufficiently spacious, hygienic, well ventilated and equipped with sufficient white and green board. All the departments are organised with separate rooms for the faculty members and equipped with desktop computers.

The central library which is located in the front side of the college provides books, journals, e-journals, e-books and internet facility to the teaching staff and students. It is spread over 3744 sq. ft. which provides Current Awareness Services, Selective Dissemination Information, Photo copy and print copy services for the staff and students. The library aims to be fully automated in due course of time. KOHA software is installed in the library.

Our institution has integrated latest IT methods and aiming to complete automation of the regular activities of the campus. Admission, Administrative and Academic process are integrated with IT to make the process convenient and transparent.

Student Support and Progression

The students of Khoirabari college are benefited by the Government Scholarship like Post Matric and Ishan Uday. The institution initiates the provision of soft skill, Yoga and Gymnasium as life skill and ICT skill as Diploma course to the students. The institution has a transformed mechanism for timely redressal of student grievances through the grievance redressal cell. Many pass out students have been placed in different jobs. A good numbers of students are doing higher education. The College is situated in Tribal Belt and backward and remote area. The college has performed well in sports activities. A number of students have won national, state and inter-college youth festival level medals on behalf of Khoirabari college. The college has a registered Alumni Association and has been actively working as an integral Part of the institution. They organize its meeting annually within the college campus and various programme actively organized like '*Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav*', plantation and drawing. The alumni association constructed a beautiful gardens in the college, donated a water filter a book shelf. They have beautify the college by doing plantation and developing different activities in the college campus. The Khoirabari college has student union body and it has been elected through the process of election. The Union body performed different occasion and arranges different sports events, cultural and religious programmes in the college premises as per the academic calendar.

Governance, Leadership and Management

The college works for development of human resources with the values, art and culture of the society. The college follows all the rules and guidelines of affiliating university and UGC. The college has a well-defined organisational hierarchy supports decentralised and participatory management for effective decision making, policy evolving and strategy development. The functioning of the institution is in compliance with the direction and the norms of all its statutory bodies. The institution has effective welfare measures for its teaching and nonteaching staff. The management motivates the faculty to participate in seminars, workshops, conferences etc, and to enroll as members in professional bodies to update their knowledge. The quality and work efficiency of the staff is assessed by the performance appraisal system. The institution has a mechanism for internal and external financial audits. The fund mobilisation policy of the institution is based on its ideology of rendering educational service The College infuses team spirit and co-operation amongst the students which is evident in College Week and other departmental activities. The Students' Union Body of the college assures students full participation in various activities.

The Governing Body of the college supervises the smooth functioning of the administration and academic well being of the college. All the decisions regarding policy and planning is handled by the Governing Body consisting of the representatives of all stake holders. The college construction committee monitors the infrastructural development of the college and estimates the fund allocation in different developmental schemes. The college maintains different funds like General Fund, Games Fund, Examination Fund etc. the accounts of which are maintained with separate cash book, ledger book, passbook etc. The accounts are audited by the certified Chartered Account. The IQAC of Khoirabari College was established in the year 07-04-2017. The Quality Assurance Cell of the institution takes care of the regular planning and execution of all the quality initiative and quality assurance initiative measures adopted and implemented by it. The main task of the IQAC is to effectively plan all quality measures to sustain and enhance quality in all the activities of the institution.

Institutional Values and Best Practices

Khoirabari College, being an institution of higher education always encourages the institutional values and social responsibility through practicing the lessons of dignity, equality and rights of individuals. For firm implementation of these initiatives the college has set up different committees like Women Cell, Anti Ragging

Cell and Grievances and Redressal Cell to monitor the matter. The College is very much concerned about the safety and security of the students, employees and the College property. To initiate this measures boundary walls are constructed, Wi-Fi, CC TV cameras are installed, mock drill and awareness programms are organized, RO water facilities installed, emergency phone numbers are displayed, complain and suggestions boxes are provided, uniform, identity cards are issued to every students, employees, separate girls common room with lavatory is provided, ladies separate toilets are available.

The College has the facilities of electricity and alternative solar energy sources. It has good water facility. The College has green campus initiative for more greener environment. The College has its best practices is to developed the adopted village and Anti ragging campaign.

Institutional preparedness for NEP

1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary:	Khoirabari College continuously strives for expansion of quality in higher education among rural, poor and socio-economically disadvantaged group of students. Our college is prepared to face the change in education system. Importance will be given to liberal education, value based education and environmental education. The stress is given on project work, Field work and experimental learning and made Environmental Studies a compulsory subject and teaches traditional and ethical values and made skill subjects compulsory for the students who are free to select skill courses of any department.
2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):	The college has not registered under ABC but has plan to do so.
3. Skill development:	The college has plan to introduce more skill oriented and job oriented courses and made skill subjects compulsory for the students who are free to select skill courses of any department. Moreover, the college has constantly advising its students to undergo different online courses conducted under NIELIT, MOOC etc.
4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):	In view of better communication, the students are taught in both English and Assamese. Sometimes Bodo language is also used for Bodo students The college is planning more orientation to the faculties for effective teaching in both the languages. The college has introduced CBCS system and is making efforts to transform its curriculum towards Outcome Based Education.
5. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):	For Outcome Based Education along with traditional courses. To meet the NEP, college has planned to implement interdisciplinary program and inter departmental program focusing on Outcome Based Education.

1.1.1 The Institution ensures effective curriculum planning and delivery through a well-planned and documented process including Academic calendar and conduct of continuous internal Assessment

Response:

Khoirabari College has implemented Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in 2019 in all the departments as per the regulations of Gauhati University, Guwahati. In 2020 the College has implemented CBCS Course under Bodoland University. The college as well structured Outcome Based Education (OBE) process for the effective implementation and delivery of the curriculum to make the students socially committed, employable, innovative and research oriented.

Curriculum Delivery and Planning Process

- At the beginning of the session the academic council along with IQAC meets and plans the strategy for effective delivery of the curriculum. The council has analyzed the results of previous year and measures are taken of necessary. Khoirabari College has been focusing on a well planned, student centric routine to cater the interest of 1280 students from eight departments and PGDCA.
- To prepare college routine a routine committee is formed every year. While preparing the routine some aspects are taken into consideration such as guidelines of UGC and the affiliating university, infrastructural conditions, one class is allotted to each credit, generally first class of the routine is allotted to Honours course, more than three consecutive classes are not allotted and more than three teachers of any particular department are not engaged at a specific time.
- Academic Council designed the prospectus which disseminates information regarding the programmes and courses.
- Each department calls a meeting and prepares schedule of work in the form of departmental time table, division of syllabus and allotment of classes to individual teachers. Each department follows the academic calendar issued by the affiliating university.
- The college also prepares an academic calendar including schedule of sessional examination, cocurricular activities. Academic calendar and time tables are displayed on notice board of the college. The principal and IQAC monitor the progress at regular level. All the departments prepare teaching plan according to the plan formulated. All the teachers maintain Teacher Diary.
- Use of ICT, E-Learning resource is taken in curriculum delivery (PPT, subject related audio video clips etc.)

Curriculum Implementation Process:

- Orientation class is conducted for newly admitted students.
- Seminars are organized for the students of Honours Courses where students are encouraged to present their topics. Quiz competitions are also conducted. Home assignments are also given to the students. Field study and Educational Trips to places are organized by the departments and keep records of such activities.
- The college conducts centralized sessional examination for every semester after which department

level meetings are organized.

- Remedial classes are organized.
- A course completion report for each semester is prepared by the department and submits to IQAC.
- The Feedback regarding the curriculum from the students, teacher and alumni is collected and analysed.

IQAC makes necessary modifications in curriculum delivery based on curriculum feedback from stakeholders and result analysis.

1.3 Curriculum Enrichment

1.3.1 Institution integrates crosscutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability into the Curriculum

Response:

The college has been always sensible towards these crosscutting issues. Being an affiliated college the curriculum of Gauhati University and Bodoland University are followed in the institution and it integrates to some extend all the above crosscutting issues through different programmes. Besides the certificate course also include some issues.

Professional Ethics: Political Science, Education Assamese, Bodo, Economics, Geography and English have included some elements of professional ethics in the syllabus. The topics like principles of quality control, conduct in work place, ethical behavior, equal treatment to women, respect for senior citizen, maintenance of cleanliness and hygiene. English in 1st semester, 2nd and 3rd semester in Political Science and 3rd and 5th semester in Education touch these issues.

Gender Sensitivity: The syllabus of Economics, English, History, Political Science, and Education include issues related to gender sensitivity. Economics has this issue in 5th and 6th semester. English has in first and 2nd semester, History has all semesters, and Political Science has in all except 3rd semester. Education has in 5th and 6th semester.

Human Values: The College is sensible towards human values. The students are taught various issues in respect of this. Topics such as family, society and community, social relationship, social control, process of socialization, functions of culture, social maturity, value and peace education, human right, are taught in Economics, Education, English, History and Political Science. Economics and Education have this topic in 3rd semester, English has in 1st and 2nd semester, History has in 1st and 3rd semesters, Political Science has in 2nd, 4th and 6th semesters.

Environment and Sustainability: The College runs a compulsory paper for all called Environmental Studies in Second Semester which deals with environmental protection and sustainability. Apart from this, the curriculum of various departments also includes issues like environmental protection, tea plantation, paperless campus, solid waste management, solar energy, pollution free earth, plastic free zone etc. Economics covers this in 5th and 6th semester. Education has in 5th and 6th semester. Political science has in 2nd semester. Geography has in 4th and 5th semester.

2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system

is time- bound and efficient

Response:

The college maintains full transparency in internal assessment and adopts the procedure to enhance the quality of such assessment. The evaluation blue print has normally been earmarked by the parent university through the syllabus. 80 marks of each paper are at the disposal of the university and set in the end semester examination. The other 20% is being sessional part (this 20 marks accrued of 5% from 1st sessional, 5% from 2nd sessional, 5% from attendance, 5% from assignments, group discussion, field study etc. The answer scripts are discussed with the students for identifying the weakness of the students.

Examination Committee:

Khoirabari College has a separate examination committee to look after the examination related works. Every year a new examination committee is constituted according to the proposal of the teacher. The committee is headed by the Principal as Examination–in- Charge with one Additional examination- in- charge from the teaching faculty.

Evaluation:

The College conducts unit test and sessional examination according to guidelines as prescribed by Gauhati and Bodoland University which is published in college prospectus. After the completion of the internal examination evaluation is conducted. Marks of sessional test are displayed on the notice board and answer script are shown and discussed with the students. On the eve of every semester examination previous years question papers are discussed and solved the queries of the students. The Library stores the University question papers of past years and makes available to the students to help them prepare for examination.

Assignments:

Home assignments for all papers are compulsory for every student. Proper weight- age of attendance in internal assessment is strictly followed. Group discussion, home assignment, seminar are held as a part of internal assessment.

The College has formed the Grievance Redressal Cell for the welfare of the students. The cell is accountable to meet up grievances of the students according to the parent University rules and regulations.

Grievances at College level:

- The students are allowed to make queries about the marks obtained by them in a particular subject.
- The HoD of each department is entrusted to look into the grievances of the students to deal with. Moreover, the concerned teacher explains the answer scripts before the pupil for his/her satisfaction.
- If any discrepancy is detected then answer scripts are re-evaluated without any delay, corrections are made and recorded in the progress report
- Grievances not solved by the respective departments are redressed by the Examination Committee of the College.
- To raise a grievance a written application is sought from the student regarding his/her grievance.
- If he/she is not satisfied with the decisions at the Departmental Level, he/she may approach the

Principal.

Grievances in University level:

- A student can approach to the University if he/she is not satisfied with the results at college level. Then he/she may apply to the Controller of Examination of Gauhati/Bodoland University with forwarding of the Principal.
- In such case, the College supplies the answer script to the University for verification.
- The controller of examinations enquires the grievances and redresses it.

The institution, established in 1993, is situated on a peaceful rural area comprised of 30 Bighas of land to provide an equipped academic ambience. There are 3 digital classrooms, three projectors, and a computer laboratory with 32 numbers of computers. The remaining are well equipped to meet the needs of the students with required teaching learning aids.

Classroom Facilities:

- There are 12 nos. of classrooms out of which 3 nos. is ICT enabled classrooms with projectors.
- Classrooms are equipped with Wi-Fi facility to enable effective teaching learning experience.
- All the classrooms are sufficiently spacious, hygienic, well ventilated and equipped with sufficient white board, 404 nos. of join desk benches and 231 nos. of pair desk benches.
- All the departments are organized with separate rooms for the faculty members and equipped with desktop computers.
- CCTV cameras are installed in the campus.
- Lights and Fans are available in the Classrooms.

Laboratory Facilities:

- Department of Geography and Education have laboratory facilities.
- Laboratories have various practical equipment's.
- Computer facilities are also available in the Laboratories.

Computer Facilities:

• Including 32 (Thirty two) Nos. of computers in the computer laboratory there are total 54 (fifty four) computers in the College.

- 9 (Nine) Printers, 2 (two) Copiers, 2 (two) Projectors and 1 (one) Sound system are available.
- There are three Interactive LED Display Screens for smart classroom.

7.2 Best Practices

7.2.1 Describe two best practices successfully implemented by the Institution as per NAAC format provided in the Manual

Response:

1. Title of the practice: -- Social Services in the Adopted Village

Khoirabari College as an institution believes the social welfare of the society through the application of class room training as well as both application and instruction to the outside classroom. The institution within the campus of the college manages to uplift the good habits of the students by obeying the rules and regulation of the college since the first day of admission of the students. Some best practices for the development of the social responsibilities undertaken by the institution are as mentioned below.

a) Objectives of the Practice: --

1. To encourage the students of the college to the additional social responsibilities in the community life.

2. To Make the Villagers aware about the health and education related issues and developmental aspects of the society to make dynamic with the help of student community.

7.3 Institutional Distinctiveness

7.3.1 Portray the performance of the Institution in one area distinctive to its priority and thrust within 1000 words

Response:

Performance of Khoirabari College as an institution in a distinctive area of priority and thrust.

Khoirabari College being a higher educational institution in remote area always tries to make social contribution, apart from academic service. The Devalaya area is full of scattered Archaeological remains of a ruined SHIVA (Temple) Devalaya of 9th to 10th century A.D. The department of History has signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with Sri Sri Tamreswar Devalaya on certain terms and conditions.

The department of History, in collaboration with other department of Khoirabari College will enhance cooperation in searching out the lost royal 'Copper plate Inscription' of Sri Sri Tamreswar Devalaya, issued in the year of 1786 A.D. by the Ahom King Gaurinath Singha of Assam.

Khoirabari College feels proud in recovering Copper plate Inscription of the Devalaya as it was under preservation of the Directorate of Historical antiquity of Assam.

Similarly, the department of History has been in association with the management committee of Sri Sri Tamreswar Devalaya in approaching the Directorate of Archaeology, Assam for further Excavation in the plinth of the Devalaya for new discovery. It is noteworthy that the first excavation was undertaken in 2006-07 by the Directorate, but it was not completed. Therefore, the joint committee urged the Directorate to adventure second phase of excavation shortly. The response of the government is waited. Moreover, the teachers of Khoirabari College have been often playing a role of a guide to tourist, researchers and devotees for a long period. The Students and the teachers of our College visit the Devalaya from time to time specially in the festival and involve the cleanliness drive and protection of this historical place.

Apart from the department of History, other department of Khoirabari College has been rendering service to different fields. For smooth functioning, the departments have already signed memorandum of understanding with different institutions.

According to the understanding of the MOU, Departments of Khoirabari College have successfully conducted numbers of activities including student exchange programmes.
